**TELECOMMUNICATIONS (RADIO-CONTROLLED
MODELS LICENCE) REGULATIONS, 2004**

The Minister in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 110(1) of the *Telecommunications Act*, makes the following Regulations:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Telecommunications (Radio-controlled Models Licence) Regulations, 2004*.

2. In these Regulations,

"radio-controlled models" means low-power devices such as model aeroplanes, boats, racing cars or trains controlled by the radiation of electromagnetic energy.

3. These Regulations do not apply to model cars used indoors.

4. A person who is desirous of operating a radio-controlled model may

(a) on application to the Minister in the form set out in Part I of the *Schedule*; and

(b) on payment of the relevant fee specified in the *Telecommunications (Licence Fees) Regulations, 2003*, obtain a licence for the purpose.

5. A licence issued under regulation 4

(a) shall be in the form set out in the Part II of the *Schedule* with the conditions of the Licence appended to that licence; and

(b) is not transferable.

6. Subject to regulation 7, a licence issued under regulation 4 shall expire on the 31st December following the date of issue, and is renewable during the month of January in each year on payment of the relevant fees specified in the *Telecommunications (Licence Fees) Regulation, 2003*.

7. Where the licensee fails to comply with any provision of these Regulations or any of the conditions referred to in regulation 5, the Minister may cancel or refuse to renew the licence.

8. The *Wireless Telegraphy (Model Aeroplanes, Model Racing Cars and Model Trains) Regulations, 1974* are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE - *Concl'd***Conditions Governing the Licensing and Operation of
Model Aeroplanes, Model Boats,
Model Racing Cars, and Model Trains**

- (1) A licence issued under the *Telecommunications (Radio-controlled Models Licence) Regulations, 2004* may be withdrawn if any condition specified in this licence (e.g. non-payment of renewal fees) is not met.
- (2) The operation of the station referred to in the application must not cause harmful interference with any radio communication service.
- (3) The frequencies nominated in this licence are not to be regarded as permanent, but may be altered as change in frequency planning takes place or as new developments are introduced in the design of equipment.
- (4) The station shall be operated by only 1 licensee personally or by 2 persons in the presence of and under the direct supervision of the licensee.
- (5) A licensee is prohibited from holding exhibitions as distinct from normal club activities without the permission of the Chief Telecommunications Officer.

The following paragraphs 6 and 7 apply to the licensee of Model Aeroplanes only:

- (6) A licensee is prohibited from flying model aeroplanes over a residential area, a public highway or within a 3 mile radius of the Grantley Adams International Airport.
- (7) A person must be over 14 years to be the holder of a valid licence.
